Our Story

Bonar Bridge Football Club (BBFC) was originally founded in 1968. Registered as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) in 2019, the club is managed by a dedicated voluntary board of trustees with assistance from community volunteers.

The original club ceased in 2010 after 35 years of participating in the North Caledonian league. Providing the villages of the Kyle of Sutherland with a much-loved team to participate in, support, develop friendships and create valuable memories the club's cessation left a void for our remote rural communities.

In 2018 the club was reformed by a group of volunteers with a vision to create a holistic sporting and social opportunity for our communities, that would support all ages and abilities with clear development paths and long- term sustainability as a youth, league club, and community resource.

BBFC is more than just football; health, citizenship and community development are at the core of our aims. Keeping football inclusive and accessible at a local level.

We hope you enjoy reading this snapshot of the past year.

The Club is based at the Migdale Park playing fields and supports remote rural communities to have football access either as a player, volunteer, or supporter.



# Our Facilities

### Migdale Playing Field







Our Home ground is Migdale Playing Fields, a fantastic setting with views over the Kyle of Sutherland and to the mountains beyond. We are delighted to report this year, after several years of efforts by the club we have finally secured a 25-year lease of the playing field that will enable the club to make much needed improvements to the facility for the whole community to benefit. Our plans include securing the perimeter, the ground conditions, match day facilities and perhaps even an all-weather training pitch  $\bigcirc$ 

### The Clubhouse

Our clubhouse was completely refurbished in 2022. The effects of the refurbishments have been far reaching, the community has a protected asset saved from falling into disrepair. The club is able to offer appropriate facilities that support health and wellbeing in a safe and comfortable environment, and it has enhanced the feeling of community spirit, club identity and increased involvement in the running of the club, it has been a real boost. Visiting teams always comment on the quality of our clubhouse and the service provided to them by the club volunteers.





### Car park

Improvements made to our car park, in the last reporting period, have made a huge difference to the safety of our members, the volunteers and committee who worked hard to raise the funds and oversee the management of the project. Our next plan for this area is the installation of a barrier between the car park and field with emergency vehicle access and controlled pedestrian access further increasing the safe access to and from the car park and playing field. Funds have been secured for this from SSE Achany and Foundation Scotland Rosehall





### Junior Club

The Junior club is for ages 5 -11 and has a focus on football for fun that is inclusive and accessible. The club meets Friday evenings during term time and is facilitated by fifteen dedicated volunteer coaches. The club brings together children from all areas of the Kyle of Sutherland and our outlying neighbours assisting in the development of cohesion and the formation of friendships between children who attend one of the five small schools in the area. This also benefits the transition of primary children to secondary where friendships have already been formed.

To date the club has decided to remain unaffiliated to a junior league which removes the many barriers to participation competitive football places on families and children who for various reasons would be unable to commit to a competitive endeavour. We do arrange friendly games against other clubs and attend football festivals.















In the school summer holidays with thanks to funding from Creich Community Council Coire Na Cloiche fund we were delighted to be able to offer a football summer camp to 25 junior members. Three days of football fun provided by the excellent Ness Academy. Our junior

squad attended the morning session which was enjoyed by all and provided an opportunity to meet up with their club mates. This is an amazing opportunity for our young members and a boost to the club coaching volunteers who take a break over the summer holiday period. Several of our secondary members also assisted Ness Academy with the junior sessions to explore their own interest in coaching and to assist in achieving sporting awards  $\bigcirc$

Secondary



Our secondary squad training takes place every Tuesday evening. This group has created a clear pathway from junior to secondary to senior, with six secondary members invited to move forward to participate in the senior training next season.

Engaging with young people is at the heart of the BBFC. Providing young people with clear pathways to continue in sport and fitness has clear links to their continued engagement with sport as adults. At a time when young people are developing into young adults the club is assisting them into understanding citizenship, good health & well- being, and providing them with transferable skills. We continue to be members of Youth Highland who provide us with support, guidance, and a youth network.

Our secondary members were also provided with free, three-day access to the Ness Academy summer football with 3 days of afternoon training and football fun.

















This season our secondary squad had matches against Harris who made the long journey to Migdale park and Ullapool who we travelled to. These matches are a great opportunity for them to play as a competitive team and also to meet other players from different parts of Scotland.




















Chairs Message

This year we have seen good progress made on the park with a much-improved competitive side, we aim to build on that in the coming season and we are very glad to have The Breens and Tommy to take that forward. With regards to the first team special thanks go to Gordon Sparling who has been brilliant taking match photos for us. We have seen some great attendance at the games, both local faces and visitors. Home days have become a great community event and we really hope for that to continue and grow.

The Junior teams are doing well in training and these skills are paying off in their school teams and competitions, hopefully their training with us is helping with that. Last year we secured funding for Ness Academy training in the Summer Holidays and this year we have been fortunate enough to do the same, I think you will agree this is a great asset to the community kids (and parents alike)

We have been busy off the park also with some drainage works carried out, this in return should help with more home games being played at Migdale Park. We have purchased new dug outs (which are waiting in the wings to be constructed) and are in the process of fencing the top and bottom of the park. We have also upgraded the running surface of the carpark and installed streetlighting to make things safer for the children in the darker nights whilst training.

We attended Belladrum, which was a roaring success! Several volunteers from within the management and committee attended over three days with our inflatable fooseball game and a good positive attitude, and we were delighted to have been invited back again at the end of July.

Another success has been the conclusion of the asset transfer, which will allow Bonar Bridge Football Club to make plans for Migdale Park, enabling us to access funds for further projects and to improve the park for the community.

All of these achievements would not be possible without the work from the committee and volunteers, there is so much that goes on within the football club, from kit washing to drain clearing (and let's not talk about dog poo collection!) you name it we've done it, so thank you!
